

House Plants to avoid for Cats and Dogs

There are plants that have bad effects on animals. If any part of the plant-stems, leaves, blossoms, and pollen are ingested and this goes unattended it can result in poisoning and/or kidney failure. If this happens, please contact your veterinarian or poison control hotline as soon as possible.

- Chrysanthemum
- Pothos
